THE PROGRAM

The minor in Chicano/Latino studies provides undergraduate students with an opportunity to examine the historical and contemporary experiences of Chicanos and Latinos. The curriculum provides awareness, knowledge and appreciation of the language, history, culture, literature, sociology, anthropology, politics, social ecology, health, medicine and creative accomplishments in Chicano/Latino communities.

In addition to satisfying the requirements for the minor, students are encouraged to take advantage of the variety of unique educational opportunities available at UCI. Opportunities like the Education Abroad Program (EAP), the Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program (UROP) and the Summer Academic Enrichment Program (SAEP) allow students to gain real-world experience that complements their participation in the Chicano/Latino studies department.

CURRICULUM

Requirements for the minor in Chicano/Latino studies are met by completing seven courses as detailed below:

- Chc/Lat 61 (Intro to Chicano/Latino Studies I)
- Chc/Lat 62 (Intro to Chicano/Latino Studies II)
- Chc/Lat 63 (Intro to Chicano/Latino Studies III)
- Three upper-division courses selected from Chc/Lat Studies 100-189
- Spanish 2A (Intermediate Spanish) or equivalent¹

Residence requirements: Other than the language requirement, no more than two courses taken at other academic institutions may be used toward satisfaction of minor.

¹Students who are exempted from Spanish 2A based on high school study or its equivalent or through test results must instead complete a fourth upper-division course selected from Chc/Lat 100-189.
