Study Abroad Tips:

HOW TO CHOOSE A PROGRAM

Determine what is most important for you about going abroad. What are your reasons for going abroad? What do you want to get out of your experience?



ELIGIBILITY

Some programs require:

- a minimum GPA
- knowledge of a different language (if some courses are offered in a language other than English)
- Class standing: JR or SR



LOCATION

Are you drawn to a specific country, region, or city? Are you interested in a particular culture or learning a new language? Narrow down a few countries or cities that you think you'd enjoy the most being in for an extended period of time.



UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

Each university is unique and may offer opportunities and resources that others do not. For example, do you like smaller class sizes or enjoy large programs? Consider if you'd like to ...

- Take courses with local students or only UC students
- Experience joining clubs or organizations on campus
- Conduct research
- Take part in an internship















Apartment:

For those who want to be more independent; # of roommates & accommodation varies

Dormitory:

Opportunity for close interaction with other university/program students

Home-stay:

A great way to immerse yourself in another language and interact with local residents daily

Other:

- Some programs/universities provide options to choose from, and will accommodate you once you arrive in the city
- Dormitory/home-stay may be covered in the cost of tuition while apartments may not





CITY STYLE

Would you prefer a large, metropolitan global hub or a small college town? Do you prefer a city with a good public transportation system? How far would your campus or housing be from main attractions or resources? Is the place friendly to your dietary needs?









Consider: weather/climate, population size, city popularity, activities/events/holidays, etc.





FINANCIAL AID

If you're on financial aid, you might be able to use it abroad. UCEAP adjusts your financial aid budget to include program costs. In some cases, studying abroad can cost less than studying at UCI. This could be due to:

- The location—as the cost of living in a particular country is cheaper than in the US
- Through other financial aid such as scholarships (UCEAP/UCI/Other)
- UCEAP fees typically covers UC tuition, excursions, activities, and sometimes housing and meals

COURSES

What courses should you reserve to take abroad instead of at UCI? What courses do you need to set aside to fulfill before and/or after going abroad? Most students take upper division courses for their major/minor, but it isn't required.

Some students opt for taking electives or focus on learning a language. It is recommended that you petition potential courses once you've been accepted to your program and before you go abroad.

- Immersion: Customized experience where you live the life of a foreign exchange student which means challenging yourself and stepping outside your comfort zone
 - Ex: Multiple universities (60+ offered) such as in Argentina,
 Chile, Czech Republic, Denmark,
 Dominican Republic, Ireland,
 Italy, Morocco
- International: Includes built-in activities like excursions and recommended courses to help you discover and connect with local culture
 - The short, custom list of classes makes choosing super simple and keeps your study schedule under control, so you have time to explore
 - Ex: Certain university programs in Germany, Hong Kong, India, Israel, Senegal, Spain, and UK



Immersion Internships International Language Research Multi-Site



- Language: Garnered toward learning a foreign language or improving language fluency
 - May offer non-English courses and include excursions to practice outside the classroom
 - Ex: Arabic (Rabat, Amman), Chinese (Beijing, Taipei), French (Bordeaux, Paris), Italian (Florence), Japanese (Kyoto, Osaka, Tokyo), Russian (St. Petersburg), Spanish (Buenos Aires, Cordoba, Madrid)
- Multi-Site: Absorb the diversity of the food, art, people, and culture of multiple countries through prearranged courses, travel schedule, guest lecturers, and site-visits
 - Ex: Buenos Aires-Santiago, Barcelona-Florence-Syracuse, London-Paris, and Madrid-Rome







- Research: Conduct a research project and participate in unique research opportunities with experts in your field or pursue a topic independently under the guidance of a mentor
 - Work with professors and graduate students while living abroad
 - Ex: STEM Research at University of Tokyo or Osaka University
- Internship: Cultivate leadership and intercultural communication skills with professionals
 - Add real-world workplace skills to your résumé while living and working abroad
 - Ex: Summer programs in Berlin,
 Cape Town, Hong Kong,
 Singapore, Shanghai
 - Ex: Semester programs in Brussels, Edinburgh, Geneva, Paris
