Exceptions to this rule may be allowed, with prior departmental approval, for EAP, UCDC, UC Center Sacramento Intern Program.</p> <p>Students must complete 50 percent or more of the total quarter units earned at UCI before graduation through courses that are <b>NOT</b> designated as online or mixed modality by the University Registrar.</p> <p>All courses for the major must be taken <b>for a letter grade option</b>.
