During the spring quarter of the junior year or summer before the senior year, students formally apply to the Honors Program. In the fall quarter of the senior year, students enroll in INTLST H180, INTLST H190 winter and spring quarters. The Honors Program allows IS majors to engage in research leading to the completion of an honors thesis.
