THE PROGRAM

Are you interested in studying political science but do not want to major in it? You may want to consider the minor in political science. The program enables you to explore the field beyond the introductory level but in less depth than the major. Political science students at UC Irvine study how politics work at the individual, group, national, and international levels. World renowned faculty experts explore a host of topics including political economy, international relations, legal systems, political institutions, political philosophy, political ideology, political behavior and radical and ethnic politics.

CAREERS

Political science students learn how to understand politics and develop the analytic thinking and clear writing skills essential for success in a number of fields. Students may go on to pursue careers in business, international relations, law, politics, consultancy, journalism and public service as well as advanced graduate training in law, academics and public policy.

Requirements for the minor in political science are met by taking seven political science courses (28 units) as specified below:

B. Three upper-division poli sci courses chosen from one poli sci module

C. Select three courses from the following:

- Poli Sci 120-179

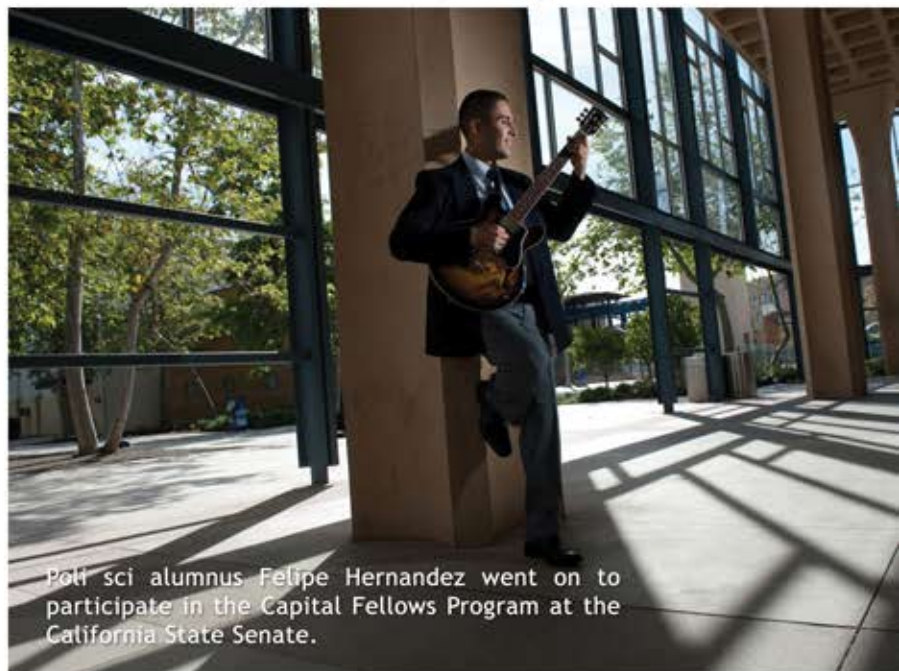
